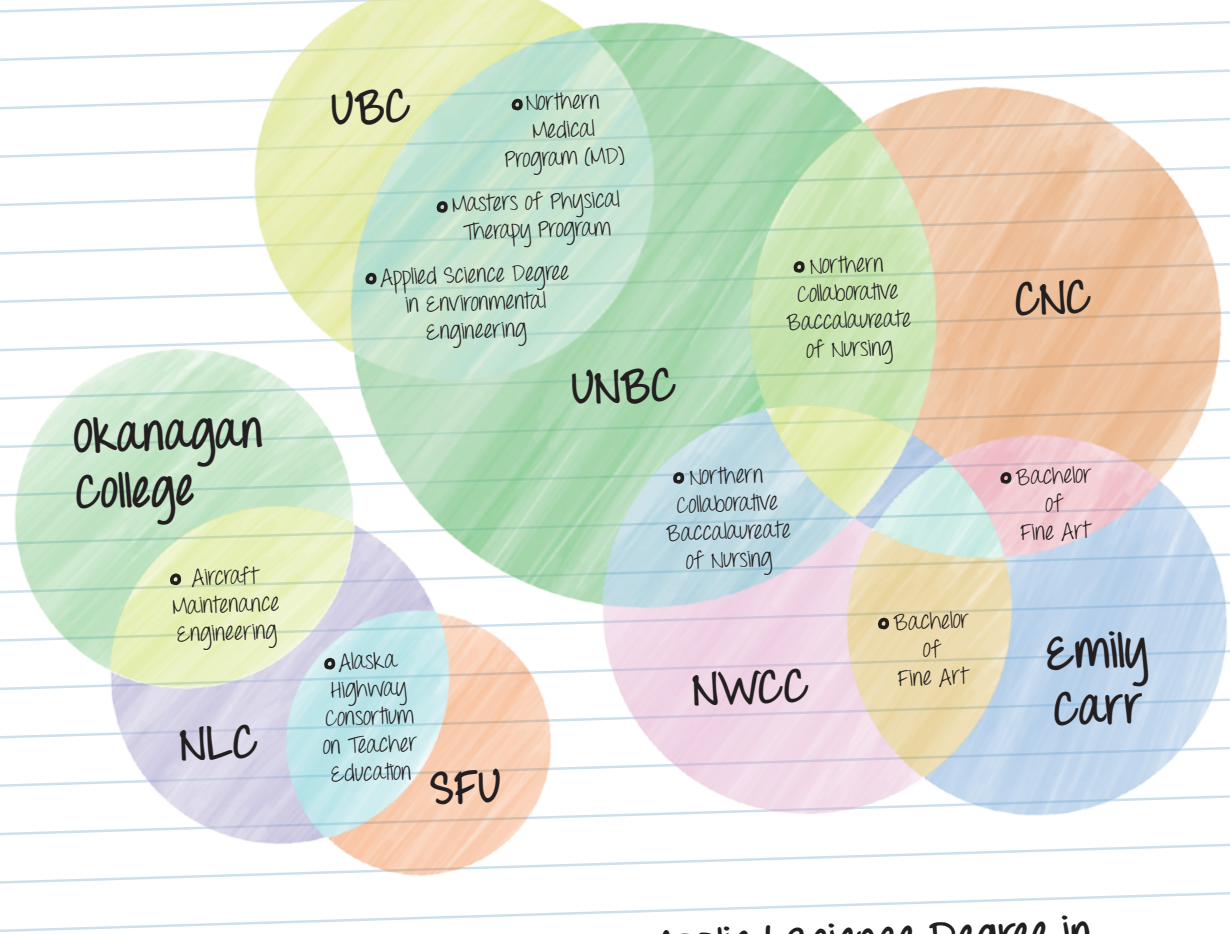

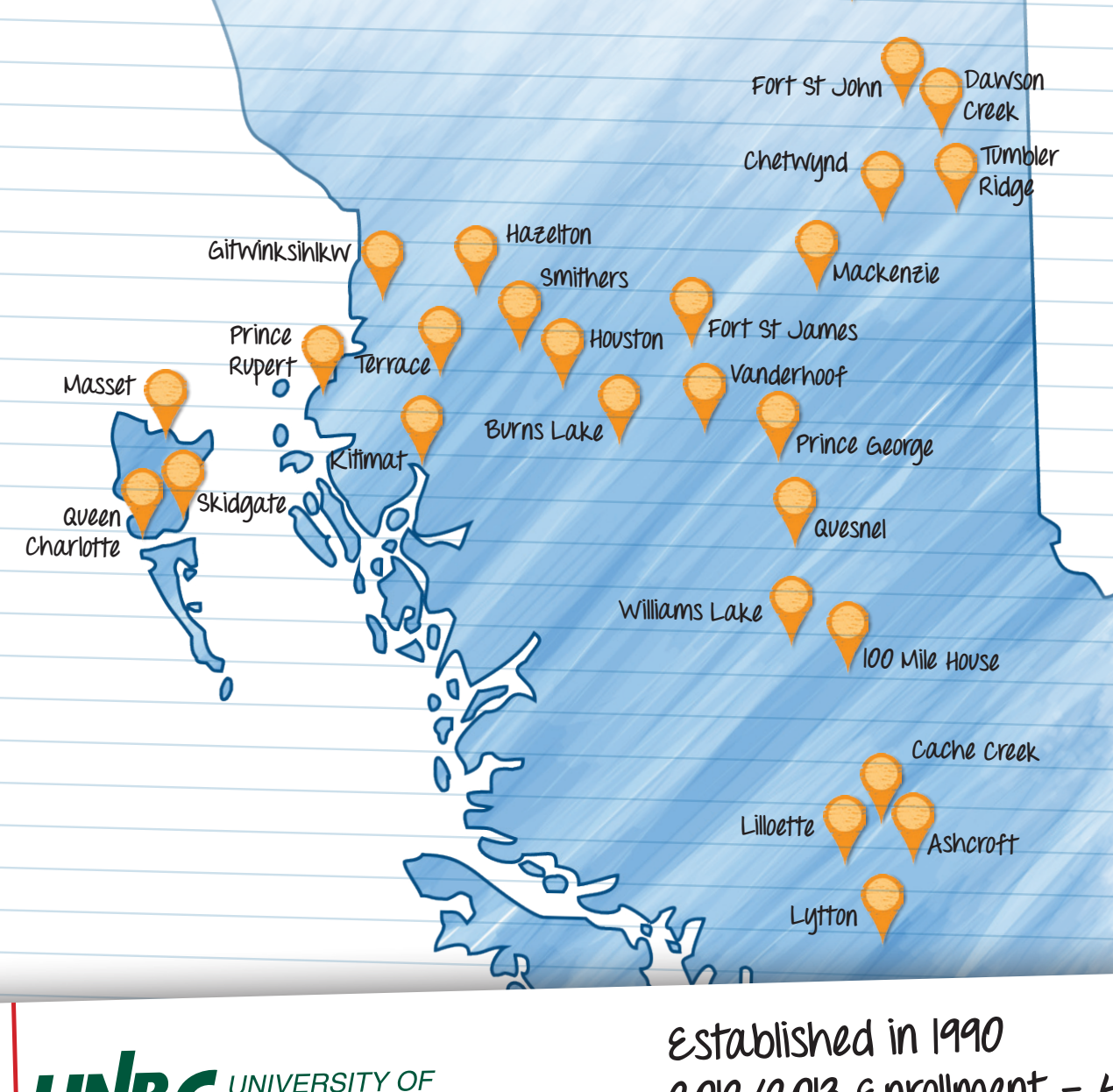

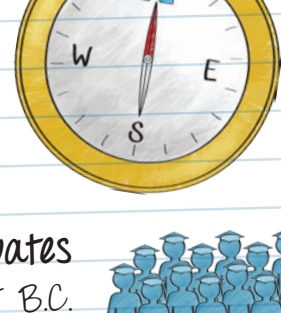


**UNBC** UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN BRITISH COLUMBIA

69% of UNBC students are from northern B.C.



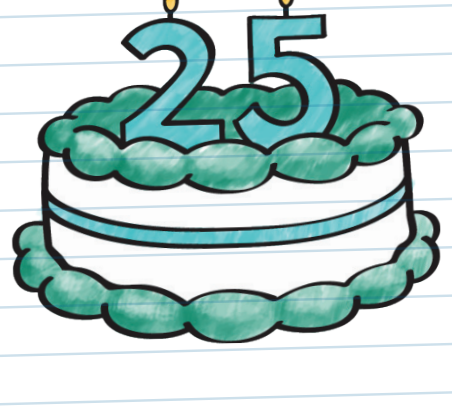
UNBC now annually produces more graduates for northern B.C. than every other B.C. university combined, even though UNBC only has 1.9% of the university seats in B.C.



**\$59,000**

UNBC grads from 2010 had an employment rate of 92%, four percentage points higher than the provincial average. In addition, they earned an average of \$59,000 per year, roughly \$3,000 higher than the average B.C. graduate of the same year.

2015 marks UNBC's 25th Anniversary! Since the university's founding in 1990, UNBC has produced more than 11,000 graduates! This number includes more than 3,000 Bachelor of Science degrees, more than 2,000 Bachelor of Arts degrees, and represents the education of more than 1,000 nurses in northern B.C.

The college's name, New Caledonia, is an homage to the early explorer and Canadian historic figure, Simon Fraser. New Caledonia was the name given by Fraser to the north-central region of present-day B.C.



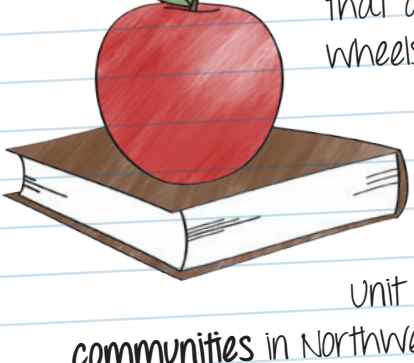
CNC had one of the lowest annual tuition costs for all B.C. public post-secondary institutions in the 2013-2014 academic year.

**NORTHWEST COMMUNITY COLLEGE**

Established in 1975  
2012/2013 Enrollment = 5,355

NWCC offers seventeen Certificates, four Diplomas, five Associate Art/Science Degrees, two Bachelor Degrees including the Northern Collaborative Baccalaureate Nursing, seven Trades Foundation Training programs, and seven Trades Apprenticeship Training programs.



NWCC has four mobile training units that are fully equipped classrooms on wheels. The Health Trailer Training Unit, Mobile Computer Skills Training Unit, Mobile Safety Training Unit, and the Heavy Duty Equipment Operator Training Unit serve 34 urban and rural communities in Northwest B.C. bringing education and training throughout the region.

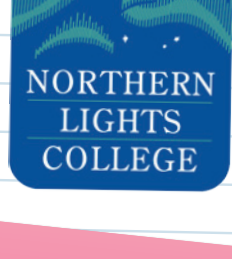
### Did You Know?

Northwest community college has an enrollment rate of 45% Aboriginal students. That's more than any other post-secondary institution in northern B.C.

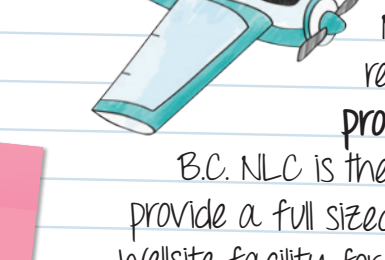
95% of students who complete their education at Northwest Community College, stay in the region and contribute to the local economy.

NLC has a nationally and internationally renowned Aircraft Maintenance Engineer program - the only one of its kind in northern B.C. NLC is the only post-secondary institute in Canada to provide a full sized earlitter drilling rig and simulated wellsite facility for oil and Gas Field operator training.

The first Northern Lights College campus in Dawson Creek was a repurposed military air defense installation which was part of the Mid Canada Line anti-air defense system.



NLC offers the only internationally certified Wind Turbine Maintenance Technician program in B.C. NLC has three Centres of Training Excellence in Aerospace, Oil and Gas, and Clean Energy (Energy House, a LEED Platinum certified building).
